History

1964-1971

- Chartered in 1964 by the North Carolina Department of Community Colleges, Richmond Technical Institute (RTI) was established to serve the citizens of Richmond and Scotland Counties. RTI provided a wide range of technical, vocational, and continuing education programs. Beginning with the Lee Building in 1967 and the Lindsey-Petris Building in 1971, the main campus was established in Hamlet, with auxiliary sites located throughout the service area.

1980-1981

- The next step in the institution's evolution occurred in 1980, when Richmond Technical Institute became Richmond Technical College. This name change was more than symbolic, as it indicated the emerging institution's academic direction and mission. In 1981, the College acquired the James Nursing Building in Hamlet as home of the growing nursing program and continued the expansion of main campus facilities for new credit programs.

1987-2006

- In 1987, Richmond Technical College was approved by the North Carolina General Assembly to become Richmond Community College (RCC), allowing for college transfer programs to be offered. As its mission became more comprehensive, the college expanded to better serve its communities. A learning resources center and a technology center were built on the main campus, while two buildings were acquired in Laurinburg to meet the needs of Scotland County.

- The focus of RCC's mission on community service was reinforced with the 1999 completion of the Cole Auditorium, which allowed the college to bring performing arts and cultural events to the service area. Increased demand for area healthcare professionals spurred the need for the Grimsley Health Science Building. This facility, built in 2006, allowed the college's large Basic Skills program to be relocated to the James Building.

2010

- An increased demand for programs in Scotland County prompted the construction of the F. Dianne Honeycutt Center in downtown Laurinburg. The facility housed a variety of curriculum and Workforce & Economic Development classes.

2014

- The expansion and renovation of the John E. Forte Building on the Hamlet Campus became home to the college's engineering, welding and machining programs. Part of these renovations also included updates to the Forte Annex building, which houses classrooms for the Electric Utility Substation and Relay Technology program and a working substation. RCC was the first college or university in the nation to offer a two-year degree program that prepares students for relay technician jobs in the utility industry.

2015

- The college initiated a move to abbreviate its name to "RichmondCC" in order to distinguish itself from the many other "RCC" institutions within the N.C. Community College System.

2017

- The N.C. State Board of Community Colleges approved RichmondCC's application for multi-campus status in Laurinburg. The college planned to incorporate two adjacent facilities to the Honeycutt Center to accommodate the expanded programming and services offered in Scotland County.

2018

- The college held a "wall breaking" ceremony in downtown Rockingham for the Kenneth and Claudia Robinette Building, housing the Leon Levine School of Business and Information Technology. The Robinette Building replaced what had been historically known as the R.W. Goodman Building on the corner of Franklin and South Hancock streets.

- RichmondCC entered into a lease agreement with FirstHealth of the Carolinas, giving the College access to 4,106-square feet of the former hospital adjacent to the Hamlet Campus to create a Simulation Learning Center. Equipped with a wide variety of low and high-fidelity programmable Laerdal manikins, video and computer equipment, the center provides realistic healthcare experiences to meet the clinical training needs of healthcare students.

- The College began offering the Electric Lineman program through the Workforce & Economic Development division, bringing short-term training for high-demand careers in the electric power industry to the region. Several acres at the back of the Hamlet Campus were cleared for a lineman yard, and a mobile unit was brought on the lot for classroom lectures.

2019

- RichmondCC broke ground on renovations to the front of the Lee Building, creating new space for Financial Aid, Student Services and the Career & Transfer Center. The College also began construction on a student cafeteria extending off of the Lindsey-Petris Building overlooking the lake.

-The College held an open house for the newly expanded Scotland County Campus that includes three buildings: the Honeycutt Center, the Morgan Center and the Covington Street Building. The Scotland Early College High School was moved to the Covington Street Building, and an Industrial Mechanics classroom was created in the Morgan Center.

2020

- Construction was completed on the front of the Lee Building, creating a new "front door" for RichmondCC.

2021

- The Kenneth and Claudia Robinette Building, housing the Leon Levine School of Business and Information Technology, opened to students and employees for the start of the spring semester. The glass and brick building provides additional classrooms and meeting spaces for curriculum and Workforce & Economic Development courses, as well as faculty offices.

- The RichmondCC Café on the Hamlet Campus opened to employees and students, offering for the first time a fully equipped cafeteria.

2022

- RichmondCC collaborated with Scotland County Commissioners and the Southeast Regional Airport Authority (SERAA) on a land transfer that would give the College property near the Laurinburg-Maxton Airport to house its own truck driver training program.

- In partnership with Hendrick Automotive Group, RichmondCC announced the plan for the Hendrick Center for Automotive Training, a 15,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art facility to be located on the Hamlet Campus.

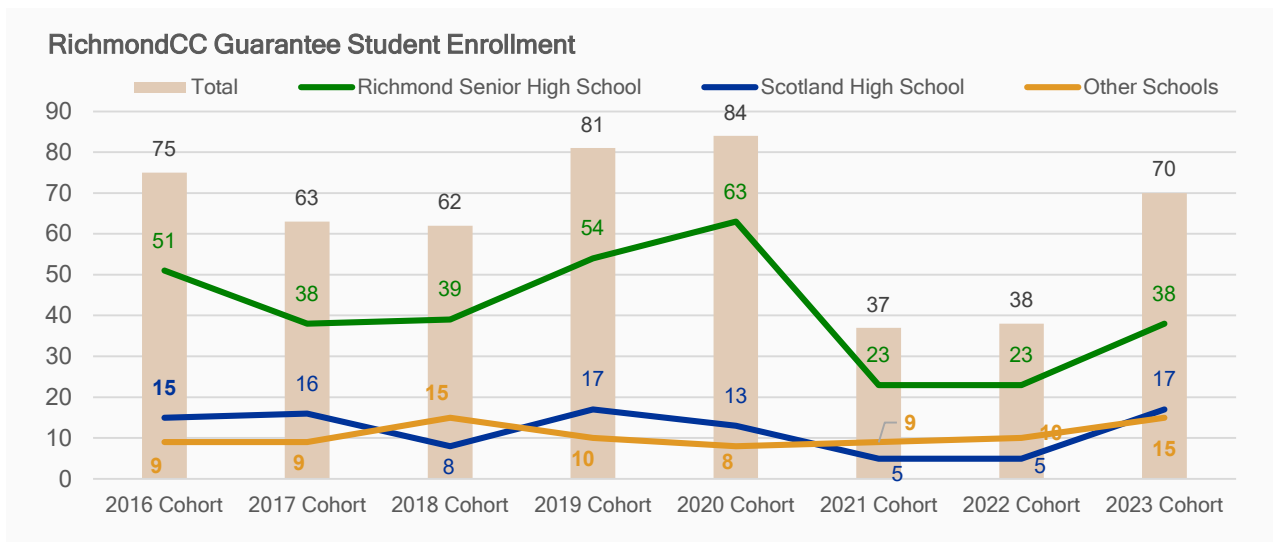

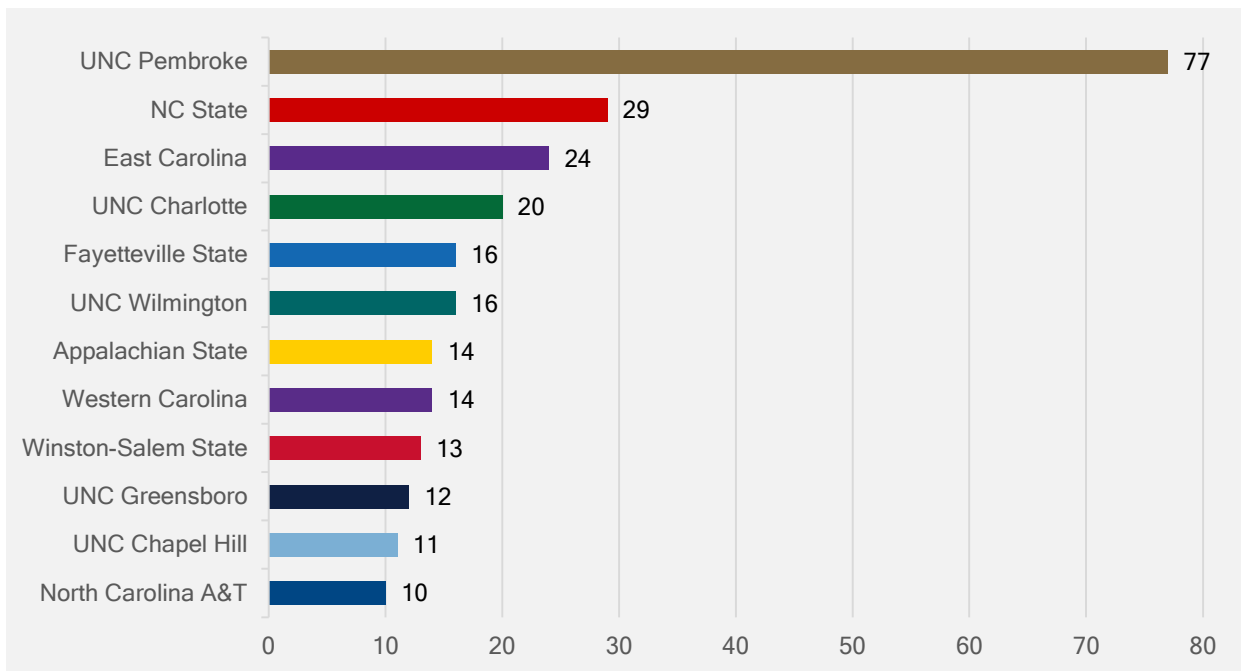
- 🔥 Of 1,711 traditional students (non-high school students excluding Special Credit students) in the 2022-2023 academic year, **78%** received Financial Aid/Scholarship. **52%** received a federal grant, **28%** received a state grant, **26%** received an institutional grant, and **1%** received a non-institutional grant.
- 🔥 In the 2022-2023 academic year, Richmond and Scotland County families saved **\$1,261,980** by taking 16,605 credit hours in high school for free as part of the Career and College Promise Program (Early Colleges and high schools).
- 🔥 **RichmondCC Guarantee:** Two years of free in-state tuition and fees offered to eligible residents of Richmond and Scotland counties



Career and Transfer

- 🔥 **75%** of curriculum students stated they have been provided information about articulation agreements (2023 student survey).
- 🔥 **61%** of curriculum students stated they have created a career plan with their advisor (2023 student survey).
- 🔥 **568** students received resume assistance by the Career and Transfer Advising Center (2022-2023).

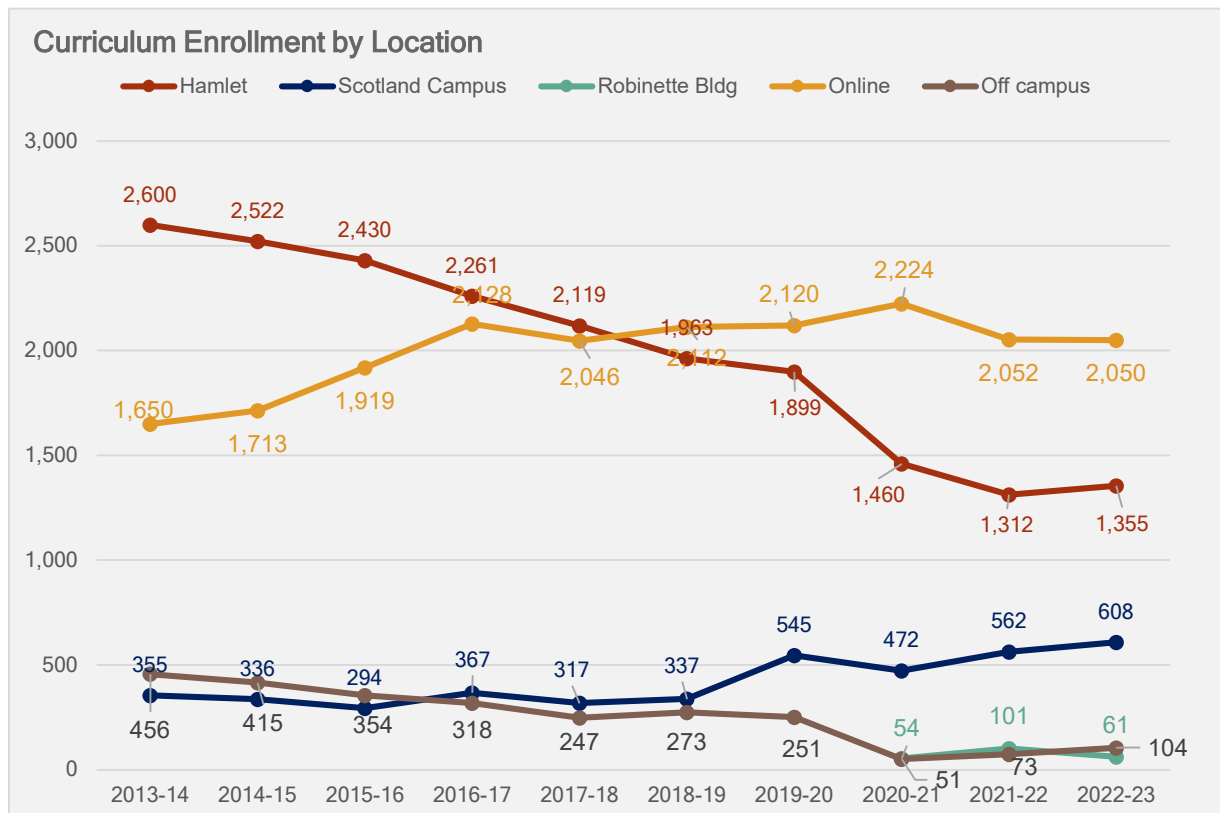

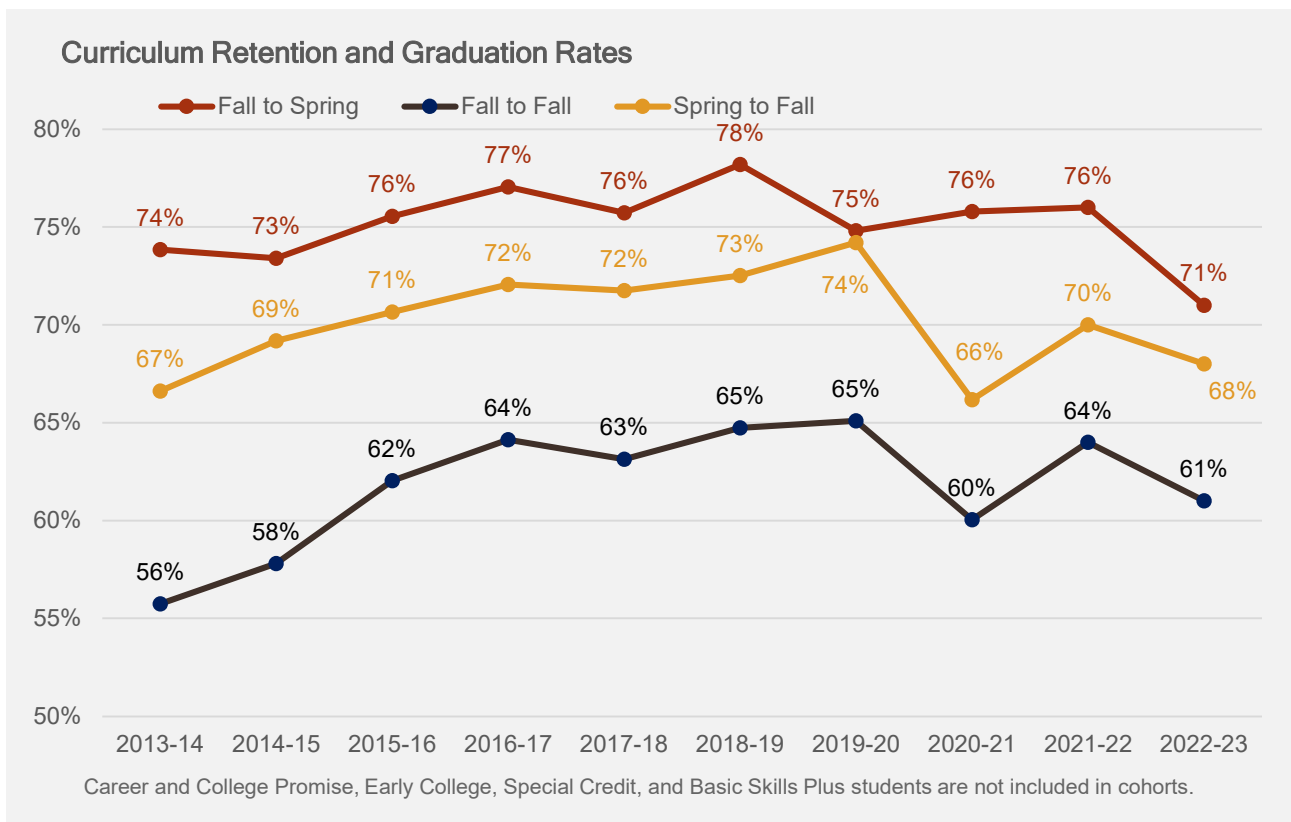

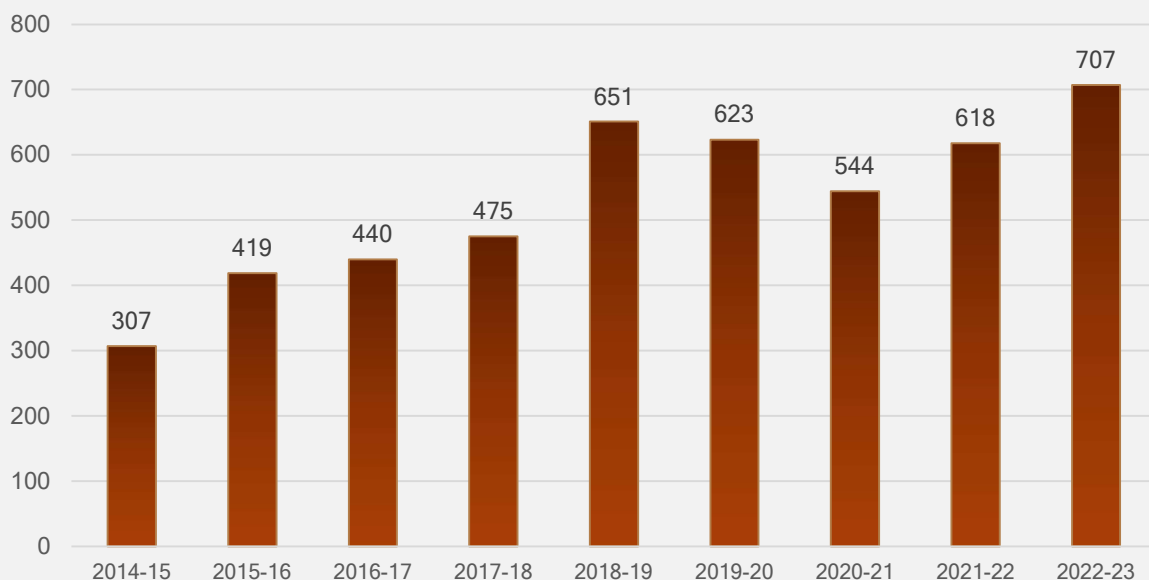
Continuing Education Enrollment

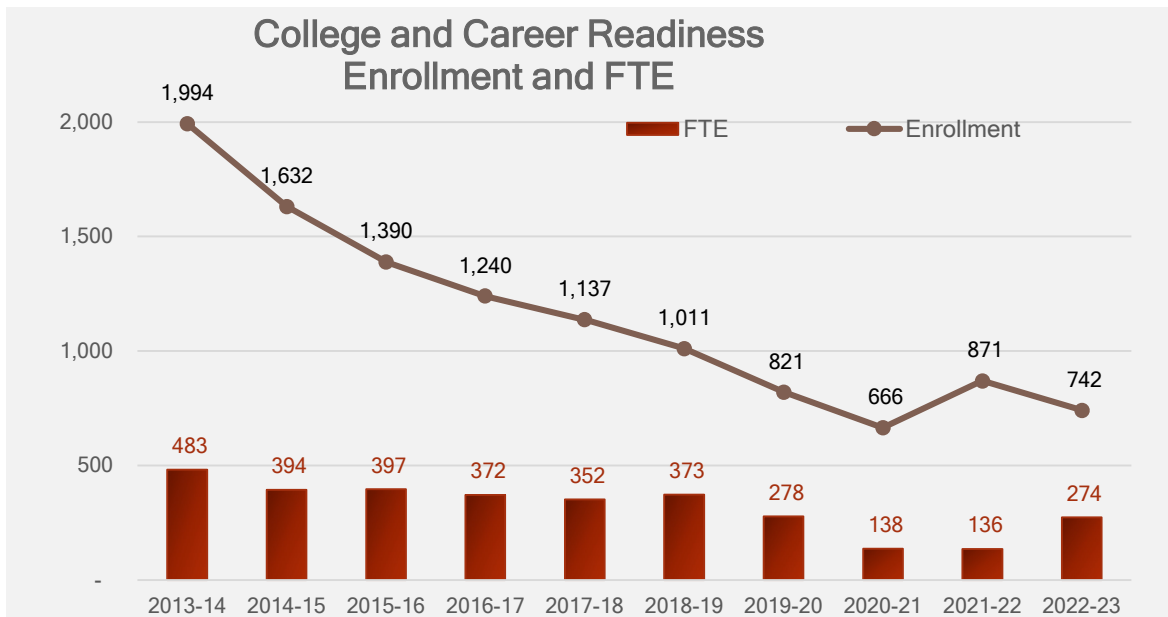
