Other Fees

Class Expectations

On the first day of class, orientation of class expectations is discussed. If you decide to **drop** the course on the first night, you will only be **reimbursed 75% of the paid registration fee**.

Class details are below:

- You can only miss 20% (16 hours) of classroom instruction.
- Minimum grade needed to proceed to clinical is 80. You will **NOT** be able to go to clinical if you are missing any of the documentation required by the 2nd week of class.
- You cannot miss clinical days, unless it is an emergency; which will require a doctor's excuse. However, students can trade days.
- 120 clinical hours are needed in order to receive a certificate of completion from RCC.

Transcripts

Placement Testing

Please call the Honeycutt Center for the next Reading Placement date in Laurinburg, NC at (910) 276-3331 or 410-1831; or Student Development at (910) 410-1730 for Main Campus testing in Hamlet, NC. Tests can be taken at Main Campus in Hamlet or at the Honeycutt Center in Laurinburg, NC.

Uniforms

A white lab coat and white uniform pants (\$50-\$75 estimate), and white shoes (\$50 estimate) must be worn during clinical.

Sponsors

If you plan on being sponsored, you must complete a “Registration form” and a “Third-Party” form will be sent to the agency you wish to sponsor you. In order for this form to be sent to an agency, you must verify that you have satisfied requirements needed in order to pre-register (placement test, HS Diploma/GED, valid driver’s license, and social security card). On pre-registration day, you must have on hand the required documents along with a check or voucher from the sponsoring agency. Seats are based on a **first-come, first-serve basis**.
